Alameda's inexperienced but eager lineup ready to play

The Alameda High Hornets buzz into the Lehigh Classic sporting a young, inexperienced but eager lineup of speedsters.

"We're small but we'll be able to get up and down the court a little bit," said head coach Eddie Ruiz. "We can run an offense if we have to."

"We like to press a little bit and keep it uptempo if we can, keep it exciting," Ruiz added. "That's what we want to do, but that's not our identity yet."

Last year Alameda went 1-2 at the Lehigh Classic, bowing out of the action with a loss to Ponderosa thanks to a last-second bucket by the Bruins.

This year, Ruiz brings another young and somewhat untested squad to Shasta Lake. Two sophomores have made a starting lineup that doesn't feature a single player with varsity experience. Terin Ford, a 6-foot-1 forward-center, is the only returning Alameda player.

"Hopefully he is going to give us some leadership. That's what we're looking for," Ruiz said.

Among the newcomers on the starting five are Taylor Takahashi, a 5-foot-8 junior who plays point; Wes Edwards, a 6-foot-2 power forward-center; Brian Dinh, a 6-foot forward; and 5-foot-10 Erik Wong, a guard.

The Hornets posted a 7-19 record last year (2-12 in the Alameda Contra Costa League).

"We didn't respond well to being out on the road," Ruiz said. "We played a lot of close games but just couldn't pull

them out. We could never get on that right level. We're in a tough league."

Despite the team's road record, Ruiz said the Hornets are looking forward to the Lehigh Classic this year. In fact, players even petitioned the principal to include the tourney in travel plans despite a couple of derogatory comments players overhead last year.

"There were some issues last year but the coach handled them," Ruiz said. "The kids went to the principal and asked if they could go back—that's how much they wanted to go."

It's a Parent where WV strength lies

It's no secret that much of West Valley's game plan revolves around Garhett Parent.

The 6-foot-6 senior, who was last year's MVP in the Northern Athletic League and an All Northern Section player, is kind of hard to miss. But that hasn't stopped head coach Eric Proscher from trying.

"Don't tell anyone," Proscher joked.

The Eagles are fresh off a tournament win, defeating Central Valley in the championship game of the Durham tournament 51-50 on a buzzer beating shot by Parent.

But it was teammate Michael Ryan, another senior, who garnered MVP honors at the tournament scoring 43 points in the Eagles three games, showing that teams can't just assume if they stop Parent they stop West Valley.

Proscher has a couple of other returning players in guard Ethan Ostrom and forward Wyatt Gover. Gover started last year as well.

"We have five football players on the team and three of them start," Proscher said. West Valley's football team advanced all the way to the section title game, so they're looking to get those players up to speed and basketball-minded as soon as possible, he said.

As for the Lehigh Classic tournament,

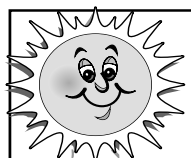

Ponderosa coach sees his MaxPreps Web site sweep the country

As the father of three ballplayers and an assistant coach of the Ponderosa High Bruins, Andy Beal was already knee-deep in hoops.

In 2002, after becoming increasingly disenchanted with the local newspaper coverage, Beal launched SacPreps.com and found himself up to his chin in hoops - and loving it. The site was a hit, allowing players, fans, coaches and sports-writers access to scores, rosters, standings and stats for teams throughout the Capitol Region.

"We made an effort and it worked out well," said Beal, whose youngest son, Rhett, is a starting senior for Ponderosa.

A year later, Beal acquired North State Prep Update, a critical move that expanded his reach into the north state and brought site founder Kevin Askeland and photographer Todd Shurtleff onto Beal's staff.

And thus was born MaxPreps.com, which today is the largest high school sports Web site in the country. The site serves 2.5 million people a month and offers nationwide coverage of varsity football, boys and girls basketball, volleyball and, launching this spring, baseball and lacrosse.

The site's core content is schedules, scores and stats, provided by a network of approximately 25,000 coaches and delivered by some 200 sideline video reporters, 32 freelance writers and four paid staff writers.

In April, MaxPreps.com was purchased by CBS and is now part of CBS-owned College Sports Television, a digital and cable programming company dedicated to college sports. Beal remains as MaxPreps' CEO.

"The company has been built on Ponderosa grads, and I couldn't be prouder," said Beal, who continues to serve as an assistant to Ponderosa head coach Dave Millhollin.

Millhollin met Beal during the 1996-97 season - Millhollin's first year at Ponderosa - and the two became fast friends. Beal got involved with the local

youth basketball program and started bringing his kids to Ponderosa games and eventually was added to the coaching staff.

The older Beal kids, Ryan and Russell, have been named MVPs of the Lehigh Classic in 2002 and 2005, respectively. Millhollin said Russell Beal had the distinction of being only the second Ponderosa player to spend every day of his prep career on the varsity team.

"Andy has been in basketball Shagri-La," Millhollin said. "He has seen all of his boys become impact players."

"It's been terrific," Beal agreed. "It's given me a lot of joy. I love basketball and I love being involved in it at the high school level."

"What's been really neat for me is that MaxPreps is such a cool Web site and I know the guy who owns the company," Millhollin said. "I reap the benefits of all that MaxPreps has to offer."

Also exciting, Millhollin added, is seeing Ponderosa High graduates finding exciting high-tech work with the site.

"It's really rewarding to see that," Millhollin said. "He has some really talented Ponderosa grads working for him."

Ponderosa looks to recapture Lehigh title with 'rebuilt' team

The mighty Ponderosa Bruins were felled last year, losing to host Central Valley in the championship game and snapping a four-year run of Lehigh Classic titles.

Last year, though, was a rebuilding year for head coach Dave Millhollin's Bruins, who fell just short at the Lehigh tourney and also ended a run of 20-plus wins a season that stretched over five years.

"This year we're close to being rebuilt," Millhollin said. "We've got pretty good players at every position."

The Bruins feature a nice core of returning varsity players, starting with Rhett Beal, a 6-foot-4 guard-forward. Rhett, a senior and third-year varsity player, is the youngest of assistant coach Andy Beal's three sons and is following in his siblings' big footsteps. Both Russell and Ryan Beal have been named MVPs of previous Lehigh tourneys.

Eric Rowe, a 6-foot-1 shooting guard and 6-foot-5 Alex Martin, a post player, are also returning seniors. Steve Lackey, a 6-foot-7 junior center, is also returning from last year's squad.

Millhollin said Ponderosa opts for a deliberate style of play.

"We want to control the tempo based on the qualities we have and we want to take away the tempo that would benefit the qualities of our opposition," he said.

That methodical style features a stout defense; from 2002 through 2005, Millhollin said the Bruins were ranked as the state's top defensive team.

"We have a little more offensive firepower this year so we can pick up more points in transition," Millhollin said. "We're looking for offensive control and defensive containment."

New team on the block fresh off winning the Block F tournament

As hard as it may be to believe, the Lehigh Classic may have gotten even stronger this year with the inclusion of Liberty Christian - last year's Division V winners in the Northern Section who are fresh off winning last weekend's Block F Tournament in Fall River.

Eight seniors return for head coach Todd Franklin, who has been at the helm for the last 12 years.

Among them is point guard Chris Kilgore, who had 19 points including five three pointers in their opening game of the Block F with Modoc. James Jensen, a senior forward had 15 points

Talented newcomers that add a lot of height to the team include Stefan Micunovic, a foreign exchange student from Serbia, who scored 15 against Modoc, and 6-foot-7 junior Sam Hicks, a transfer from Shasta.

Franklin said he and his team were looking forward to competing in the Lehigh Classic.

"We've always had a good relationship with C.V., we play them every year," Franklin said. "And we like what Kevin (head coach Kevin Strohmayer) is doing with the program."

Senior heavy Amador finished as runner-up in Sac-Joaquin Section after taking 3rd place at 2006 Lehigh

Loaded with seniors, the Amador Buffaloes come roaring into the Lehigh Classic looking to improve on their 2-1, third-place showing in last year's tourney.

Coach Paul Neville, a 1999 Amador High graduate, has plenty of reason to feel confident about the 2007-08 campaign. His roster sports seven returning seniors, all with varsity experience. Those then-juniors helped the Buffaloes to a first-place finish in the Mother Lode League with a 12-3 record and a 25-7 overall record. The Buffaloes also captured the runner-up crown in the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section.

Coming into last year's tournament, Neville was eagerly anticipating the contributions from a strong JV class. Those players have arrived and are ready to roll.

Gone are big man Jordan O'Dell and all around athlete Aaron Westlake, but many of the rest of Shasta High School's team from last year returns.

"We've got most everybody back," Shasta head coach Bill Callaway said.

Among them are a couple of big men in 6-foot-4 post player Ryan Taylor and 6-foot-5 forward Mike Marossy.

Also back are senior guard Griffin Freed and Jacob Boyle (both of them are also 6-foot-4)

The Wolves are off to a 2-1 start this season. They lost the opening game of their own Harlan Carter tournament to Ashland, Ore., 46-44, before bouncing back with wins in the tournament over Tracy (66-53) and Pleasant Valley (51-43).

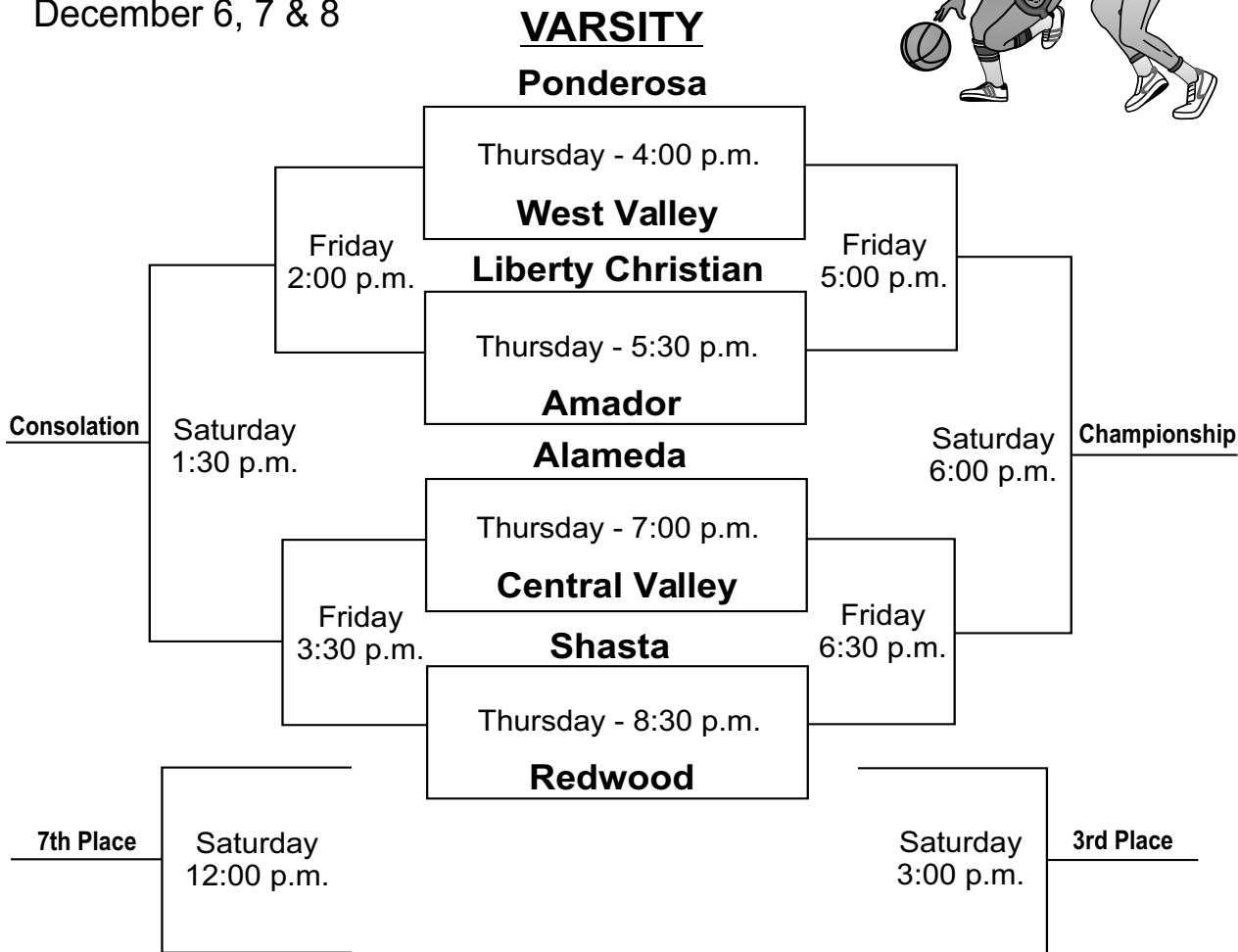
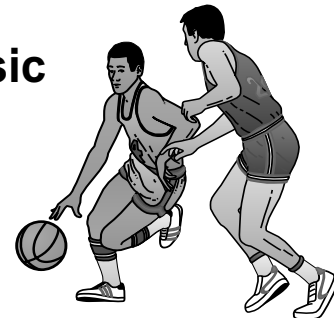

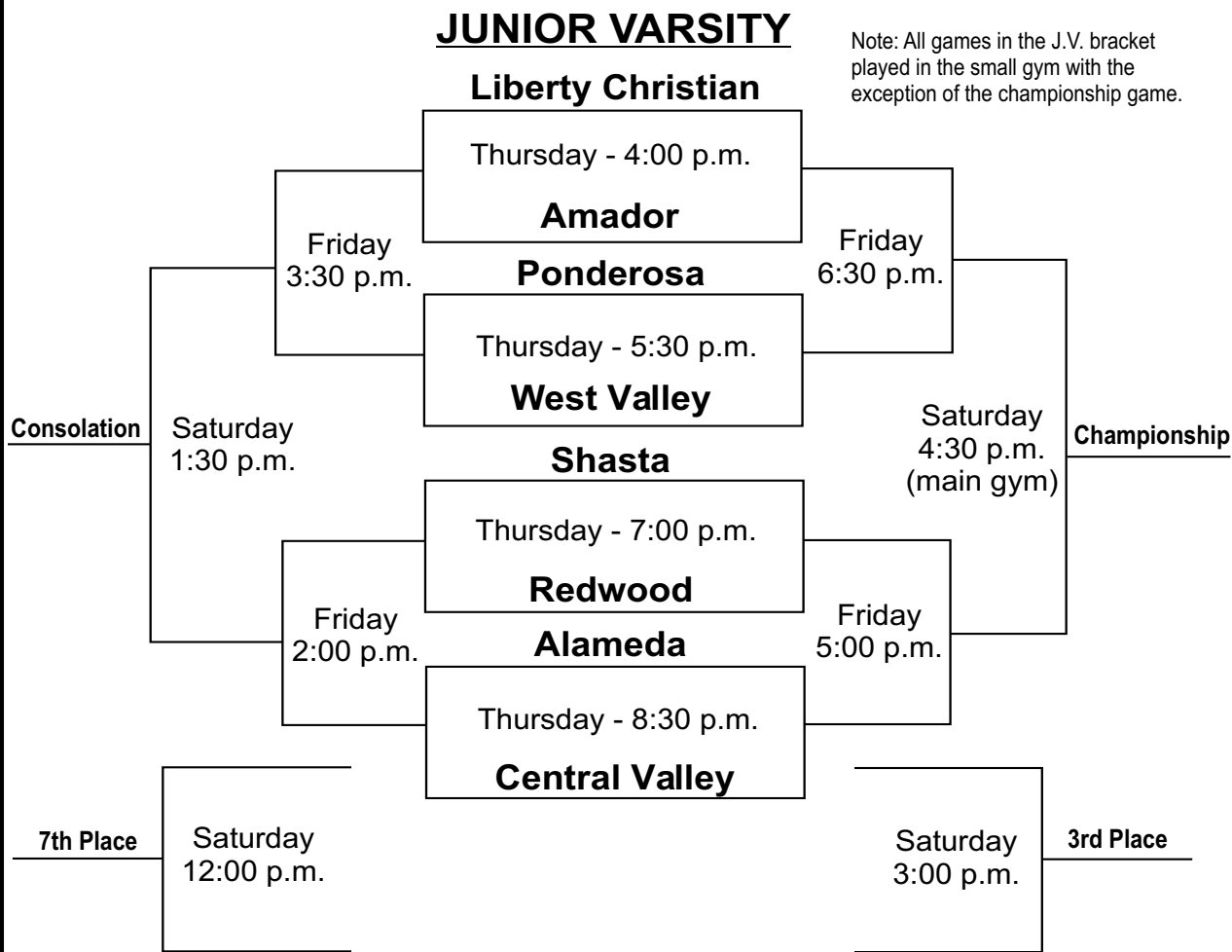
