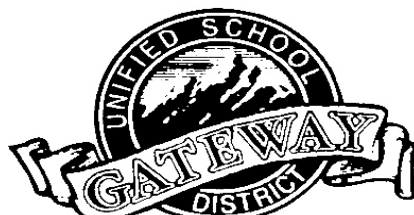

Large Eagles team off to fast start winning Durham tourney

The West Valley Eagles enter the Lehigh Classic fresh off winning last weekend's Durham tournament, including a 51-41 victory over Central Valley in the championship game.

West Valley also trounced Anderson 71-33 and beat Las Plumas 44-35 in the three day tournament.

The Eagles are led by 5-foot-10 senior point guard Troy Duenas, who averages around 11 points a game, and 5-foot-11 senior guard Anthony Sanchez, who averages around eight points.

They'll be serving it inside to 6-foot-4 junior forward Garrett Parent, who can both score and rebound for the Eagles, said head coach Eric Proscher.

Rounding out the starting five are senior guards Thomas O'Brien and Luke Westaby.

But when the West Valley coach looks down his bench to substitute, he has plenty of players to choose from.

"We do have some depth," Proscher said, noting the 15 players on the roster.

Last year, after losing the Lehigh Classic consolation game to Northern Athletic League rival Central Valley, 62-36, West Valley bounced back and went on to win the NAL title with an 8-2 record.

Small Alameda team hopes to take advantage of opportunities

The Alameda High Hornets head to the Lehigh tourney looking for opportunities.

After dropping the third-place game in last year's tournament, Alameda would like a chance to improve on its record this year.

Head coach Eddie Ruiz said Peter Kortmann, one of the few 6-footers on the lineup, will lead the Alameda attack. Kortmann, a returning varsity player, is a multi-tasker, at times playing point, shooting guard, small forward and forward – everywhere but the post.

Brandon Chang, last year's sixth man, joins the starters this year and Ruiz said James Parker, a 6-foot-2 senior, "will hopefully give us some inside presence."

Aron Boykins, who has been called up from the junior varsity squad, is expected to add some strength to the Hornet bench, Ruiz said.

Last season, Alameda compiled a 9-17 record, including a 3-11 mark in the Alameda Contra Costa League.

"We're going to be small as usual," Ruiz said, referring to the somewhat diminutive nature of his players. So, when you don't exactly tower over your opponents, you look for an edge elsewhere.

"We like to break on opportunities," he said. "We want to run when the opportunity presents itself. We're a good half-court offensive and defensive team, I think. We're just not very big. But the kids play hard. They play hard for 32 minutes, and then see what the outcome is. They've

really bought into that."

Alameda is making its fourth appearance in the Lehigh Southwest Cement Company Classic, and Ruiz said he's happy to make the drive north from the east Bay Area.

"It's an outstanding tournament, one of the best-run tournaments in the state of California, with the way they treat people and how everything runs on time."

Ponderosa shoots for fifth straight Lehigh championship

Are the Ponderosa High Bruins looking for history to repeat itself? If so, they might want to think about adding a little more space to their trophy cabinet.

The Bruins have won the Lehigh tourney for four straight years, including the 2005 contest when they got the best of Amador High (and the Buffaloes are back this year, undoubtedly with a little revenge on their minds).

If they want to make it five straight, they are going to reach that pinnacle with a team that is in the middle of some serious rebuilding. Coach Dave Millhollin said last year's entire starting five graduated, and another two seniors left campus with diplomas in hand.

Last year's Bruins team posted an impressive 21-7 record while going 8-6 in the Sierra Valley Conference.

"Over the last four years, we've had a pretty solid program, winning 20-plus games each season," Millhollin said. "This year, we have basically a new team, so we're going through the process of rebuilding and going through the process of learning the things that it takes to be successful."

"We've been very, very pleased with the results so far. We'll probably start four juniors."

Millhollin said his top returning players include Rhett Beal, a junior guard/forward who averaged 10 points and five rebounds a game.

"He will be expected to play both guard and forward, supplying scoring, ball handling and rebounding," Millhollin said.

Jacob Gubbins, a senior forward who averaged seven points and five boards, is another returning player.

Steve Lackey, a 6-foot-7 sophomore, will add some altitude to the center position and he'll be helped by 6-foot-6 junior power forward Alex Martin, a junior. Eric Rowe, a junior, will be called upon to provide some perimeter scoring, the coach added.

Buffaloes stampede into Lehigh with depth, experience

The Amador Buffaloes are stampeding into the Lehigh Southwest Cement Company Classic with hopes of stamping their hooves on the big trophy. They came close last year, losing the championship game to Ponderosa High.

Varsity coach Paul Neville has seven returning players on his roster, and six of them are seniors. Reinforcements are close at hand, Neville said.

"We have a really strong JV class coming up with about eight guys," he said. "It's a really big team this year."

Neville is in his second year as head coach at Amador, located in Sutter Creek in the Sierra Nevada foothills about 45 miles northeast of Sacramento. Last year's squad posted a 20-9 record, including 8-2 in the Mother Lode League.

Leading the charge will be 6-foot-3 point guard Nick Dani, a senior in his third year as a varsity player. He was last year's Outstanding Player in the Mother Lode League. Small forward Dave Waltman, a 6-foot-tall senior who was voted last year's league MVP, backs him up.

Brad Dobner, a 6-foot-4 junior forward and another three-year varsity player, is another player to keep an eye on, according to Neville. Dobner was a first-team all-league player last year.

Neville says the Buffaloes are defensively minded.

"We really like to put pressure on the other team and get after it defensively," he said. "We're pretty physical, but we also

Added Neville with a chuckle: "My assistant coach is old, but he's effective."

It turns out the assistant coach is Neville's father, Keith. "He does all right, as long as he doesn't fall asleep on the bench."

Shasta returns to Lehigh where they won it all in 1999 and 2000

First year Shasta head coach Bill Callaway was surprised to learn the assistant coach for his team's first round opponent, Redwood, is Scott Springhorn.

"Really? I had him in class back around 1994 at Grant Middle School when he was in the seventh grade," Callaway said. "He's a great kid and was one of my favorites."

Shasta's game with the Redwood Giants will be a return to the Lehigh Classic for the Wolves who won consecutive tournaments back in 1999 and 2000.

Shasta is coming off a 2-1 start from their own Harlan Carter tournament last weekend. They'll be led by their big man, 6-foot-7 senior Jordan O'Dell, and junior guard Tyler Kingdon, who played on the varsity last year as a sophomore.

Also on the team is first year varsity player Aaron Westlake, a 6-foot-3 senior, who sat out last year. Westlake is a good athlete who signed a D-1 baseball scholarship with Vanderbilt to be their first baseman, Callaway said. He's not too bad under the hoop either, pulling down 20 rebounds against Tracy in the Harlan Carter Tournament.

The Wolves nucleus is rounded out by junior guard Garrett Russell and junior forward Griffin Freed.

Redwood assistant a familiar face to Central Valley fans

Scott Springhorn (Central Valley High School Class of 1998) is coming home, and he's bringing the Redwood Giants with him.

Springhorn, the son of Central Valley High School teacher and track coach Bill Springhorn, is the assistant varsity coach for Redwood High School in Larkspur.

After participating in the tournament all four years of his prep basketball career, Springhorn, now in his second year as the Redwood assistant, persuaded head coach Jerry Piro to bring his kids to Shasta Lake and sample some north state competition.

After playing for four years at CV, Springhorn played an additional two seasons of basketball at the junior college level, first at Santa Barbara City and then at Shasta College. During that period, Springhorn helped Sid Albaugh, CV's current athletic director, with coaching when Albaugh helmed the CV varsity boys basketball team.

Springhorn's brother, Steve, is a 2000 Central Valley High graduate. Even though the Springhorns resided in the Shasta High School district, the kids attended Central Valley – a relationship Springhorn heartily enjoyed.

"I was very, very happy I went to CV," Springhorn said.

Prior to Redwood, Springhorn coached for three years at Jesuit High School in Sacramento. Springhorn received a bachelor's degree and teaching credential from Sacramento State University and is in his third year of teaching at San Rafael High in Marin County.

Springhorn describes his Redwood team as "pretty young" with just three seniors on the starting lineup.

"We play a pretty uptempo game with a lot of running," Springhorn said.

Matt Flaherty, a senior who has been averaging 20 points a game and double digit rebounds, leads the Giants. Other standouts include guard Ross Healy, a third-year varsity player who earned all-league honors last year while averaging 10 points and six rebounds.

Alex Monetta, a junior, takes on the post responsibilities following an all-league sophomore year while Ryan Holmes can be expected to contribute from the guard position.

"That's a solid group right there," Springhorn said.

The Giants posted an 11-16 record last year (5-9 in the Marin County League).

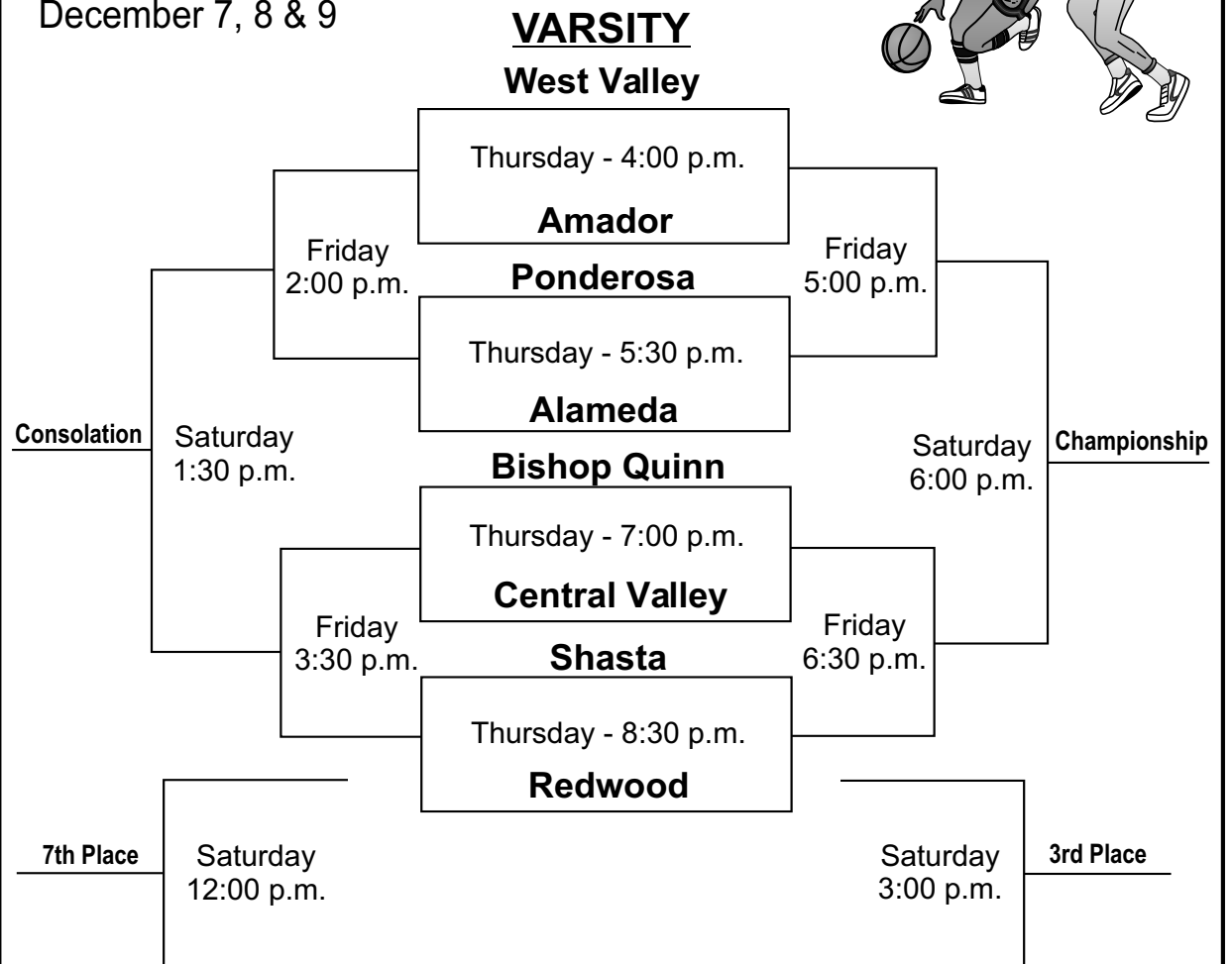

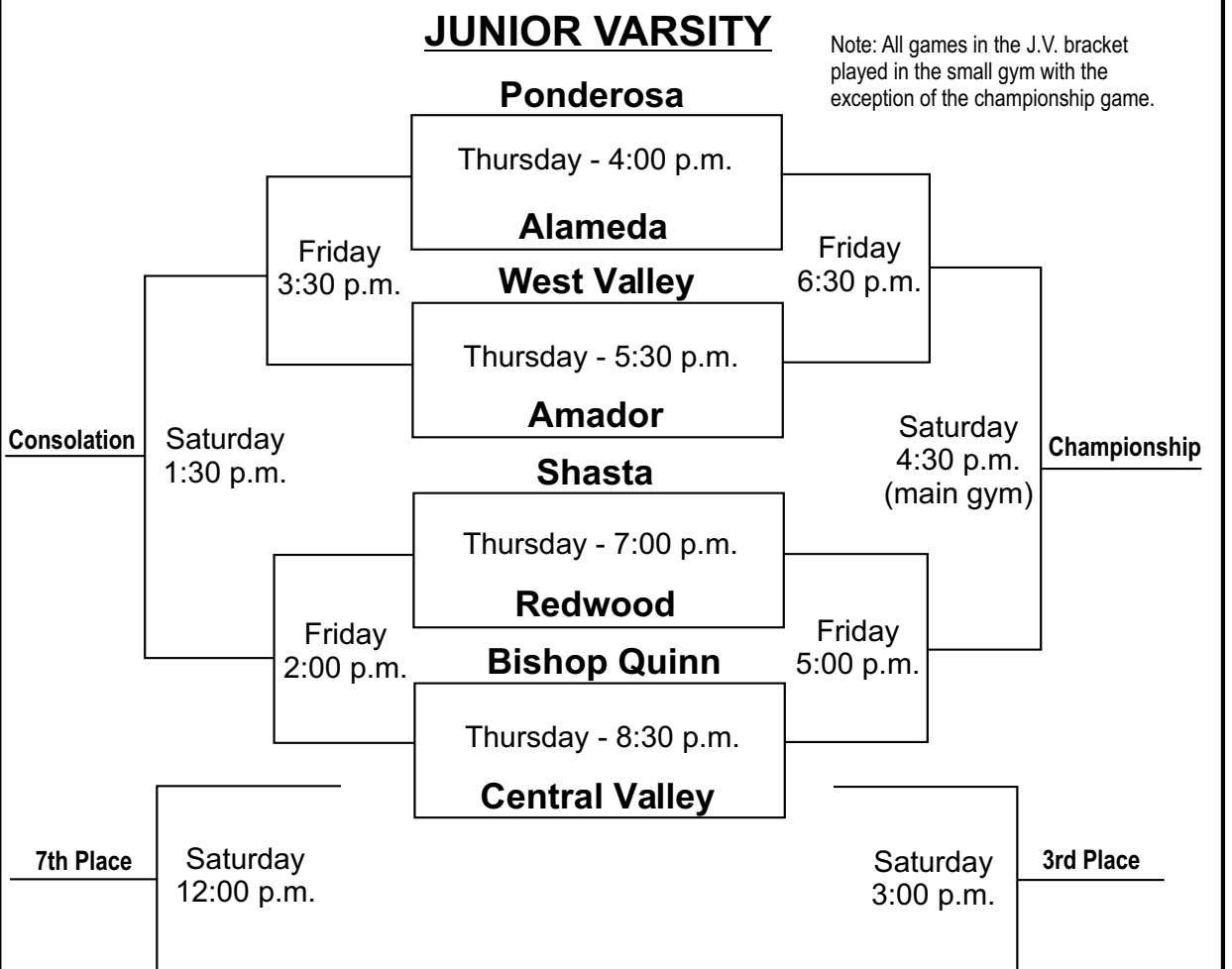
